Spokane Regional Occupational Medicine (SROM) is affiliated with Valley Hospital, Deaconess Hospital, Rockwood Clinic and FirstCare Urgent Cares. SROM's care coordination team utilizes our extensive medical network to expedite access to care and improve worker outcomes.

In addition to on-the-job injury care, Spokane Regional Occupational Medicine provides expanded occupational medicine services including:

- Work injury care and follow-up
- COHE best practice Labor and Industry care and follow-up
- Idaho Industrial
- Self-insured injuries
- DOT and pre-employment physicals
- NIDA and non-NIDA drug screen collection – 24/7 mobile drug testing service
- Breath alcohol testing – 24/7 mobile service
- Pulmonary function testing
- Audiometric screening by CAOHC certified technicians
- Hearing conservation/employee education
- School and sports physicals
- Tuberculin skin test PPD (Mantoux)
- On site vaccination clinics (flu shots, HepB, Tetanus)

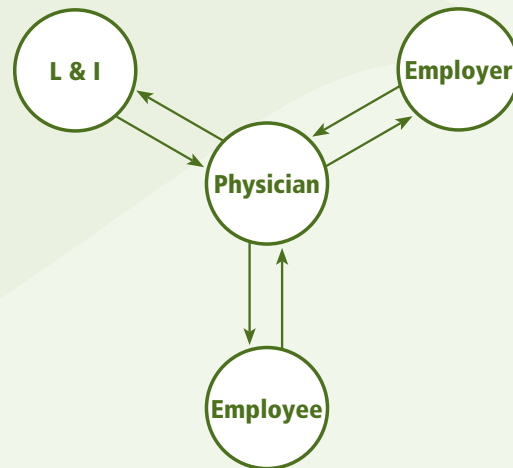


Communication

Spokane Regional Occupational Medicine's providers are COHE providers/mentors and follow the COHE best practices for L & I care and follow-up. Our mission is to get the injured workers the proper care they need to reduce recovery time and ensure a quick return to work

Our clinic provides exceptional communication between the provider, employer, employee and L & I. This timely communications ensures:

- The claim is correctly entered into the system
- All aspects (physical therapy, diagnostics, surgery) of the injured worker's care is properly coordinated and communicated to all parties.
- Injured workers receive proper compensation
- The employer is contacted with an accurate update as to an injured worker's modified duty plan, as well as overall status of the claim

1. Spokane Regional Occupational Medicine offers a needle stick follow-up clinic where your care will be monitored by providers trained in the most recent protocols for exposure care.
2. Spokane Regional Occupational Medicine can come to your clinic and offer a turn-key needle stick policy, and train your staff on what to do if an injury occurs.

Program includes:

- A "Turn-Key" needle stick program for your business
- Exposure control plan
 - Exposure checklist
 - Follow-up timeline
 - Employee injury report
 - Injured worker and source individual lab requisitions

Staff training on what to do once a needle stick or exposure occurs.

- Spokane Regional Occupational Medicine can provide all state mandated forms to assure your business follows state laws.
